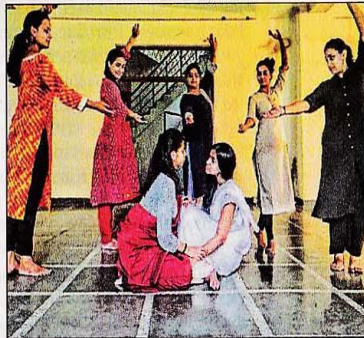


# PICK OF THE WEEK PLAYS, MUSIC, A FILM FESTIVAL AND ART FROM THE HINTERLAND

Curated by Aanchal Malhotra, *The 1947 Partition Archives*, is a multimedia exhibition that highlights unheard voices—the story of a woman still living in a refugee camp; how a city-wide Bachelors degree examination was put on hold due to a referendum in Sylhet; how two brothers travelled from the Travancore State to the North-West Frontier Province for work and were stranded during Partition.
